### II. BACKGROUP OF ORGANIZATION

CAPACITAR Rwanda is a non-profit organization created by men and women profoundly committed to a healthy society under inspiration of three people (Sr Antoinette Gasibirege, Sr Genevieve W.MD and Dr Patricia Cane). This organization was established in accordance with the article 1 and 5 of the law n° 04/2012 of 17/02/2012. It was registered by RGB as a local NGO on 20th April 2015 (official Gasette n° 16 bis of 20<sup>th</sup> April 2015). CAPACITAR has its constitution, the financial and accounting procedures manual. It has also adopted gender and safeguarding program participants' policies. And the mission of CAPACITAR is *"A Rwandan society free of any form of trauma and stress where each member live in perfect harmony with him/herself, with others and actively participate in activities aiming at his/her holistic development"*

Since 2006, CAPACITAR has worked on trauma transformation and community development in the Rwanda society after the extremely painful experiences that many Rwandans went through during the Genocide of Tutsi and its aftermaths. Many faced poverty, and psychological and physical trauma, indeed. They were also exposed to extreme physical and psychological events in form of feelings of abuse, threat or experience of violence and brutality and war. To achieve its mission, the organization has adopted 4 high level strategic goals which are expressed as broad statements of the changes they want to see in the nearby future:

- Contribute to the political, social and economic transformation (welfare promotion) of Rwandan community, with special focus on children.
- Encourage healing and transformation of body, mind and spirit in individuals and communities in the spirit (sense) of Spanish word "CAPACITAR" which means empower, encourage, bring forth
- Help people to put together their wisdom and to access to their inner power emanating from their heart, body and spirit.
- Promote peace building activities and good relationship among people.



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### II. PROJECT SUMMARY

Adolescent mothers who are victims of social and economic violence as well as children, who are sexually abused, harassed or exposed to whatever scandal such as human trafficking, need to be supported specifically by the members of their families, and by the entire community.

Furthermore, Rwanda as many other countries of Africa has a problem of adolescent mothers and young girls who get pregnancy on early age between age of 1. 13-18, according to the findings got from CLADHO's survey under financial support of KNH, this issue is at a higher rate and it has significant impact to these young girls whereby they face a lot of challenges from the first day of pregnancy and this also affect their children.

The study shown that most of teenagers get pregnant from colleagues (49%), 20% from family friends and lastly 2% from tutorials and 1 % from local leaders and they highlighted that 75% got pregnancy due to sexual violence and 25 % through voluntary sexual intercourse. Concerning the contributing factors that pushed them to early get pregnant, it was found that the poverty of parents (50%), unsatisfaction (14%) and carelessness of parents and sexual violence (9% for both) are the major factors that led them to be involved in early sex intercourse. The research revealed that most consequences and problems faced by teenagers after getting pregnancy are school dropout (50%), poverty (19%), depression (11%) and other including discrimination (5%). This situation has long-term implications for them as individuals, their families and communities.

The above mentioned study shows the most factor which pulls young girls to be pregnant on early age was the poverty. Consequently, shame and stigmatization have come the source of trauma affecting the adolescent mothers and girls who have been pregnant beyond extra marital sexual intercourses. All these issues result into certain forms of women and child abuse such as mental, sexual, physical and economic violence in their lifetime. Thus CAPACITAR will initiate the long term integrated community development program aim at contributing to political, social and economic development of adolescent mothers and their children.

### Description

The Adolescent mothers centered community development (AMCDP) is a long term integrated program based on the Self Help Group approach (SHG) which views poverty as inequality of human rights and **empowerment** as the process of ensuring equal human rights, responsibilities, opportunities and treatment for women and men in order to reach their full potential and that women are free from gender-based violence. Given the multi-dimensional nature of poverty, however, the SHG Approach puts equal emphasis on the goals of economic, social and political empowerment. In order to achieve these goals, it offers a framework and guidance for establishing a 'People's Institution' which provide an environment of trust and cooperation in which people come to realize they are able to help themselves to achieve the economic, social and political goals that they themselves define.

### Principles of Self Help Group Approach

1. Every human being has tremendous, God-given potential. This hidden potential in the poor can be unleashed if a conducive environment is provided.
2. As an individual the poor are voiceless, powerless and vulnerable. By bringing them together as a homogenous collective aware of their rights, they gain tremendous strength and can claim their rights.

### The three pillars of Self Help Group Approach




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1. By targeting adolescent women and young girls who get pregnancy, the whole community benefits.
2. When the problems are shared the community can find a solution that benefits everyone.
3. By bringing together individuals, the fragmentation of the community will be repaired.



### The three levels

1. **The SHG methodology** envisages a three social formation component starting with a **Self Help Group** of between 15–20 members (identified through a community driven criteria of being the poorest of the poor)
2. After at least 6 months, between 8-10 SHGs form a **Cluster Level Association (CLA)**
3. Ten or more than strong and mature (at least 6 month old) CLAs form a **Federation**
